Construction Updates



First Phase Begins Next Week

The first phase of the traffic control plan will begin Monday, September 30 at the intersection of Holly Road and Everhart Road, to Cain Drive. Work will include excavation for underground utility and manhole placements.

During this phase of construction, traffic along Everhart Road, from Holly Road to Cain Drive, will be affected. The two northbound lanes and sidewalk will be temporarily closed. The southbound lanes will be converted into two-way traffic to accommodate traffic flow from both directions. Left turns will be prohibited from southbound Everhart Road onto Holly Road. Additionally, drivers will not be allowed to make left turns when leaving business driveways to get back on Everhart Road, between Holly Road and Cain Drive. See the photos below for closures. **All work is weather permitting.**

The City advises business owners to alert their customers about these upcoming lane closures and prepare for delays in the area. The City wants to remind drivers to use caution when driving near the work zone and to follow detour signs.
